 - letter of excuse from parents (maximum of 5 letters per semester allowed).



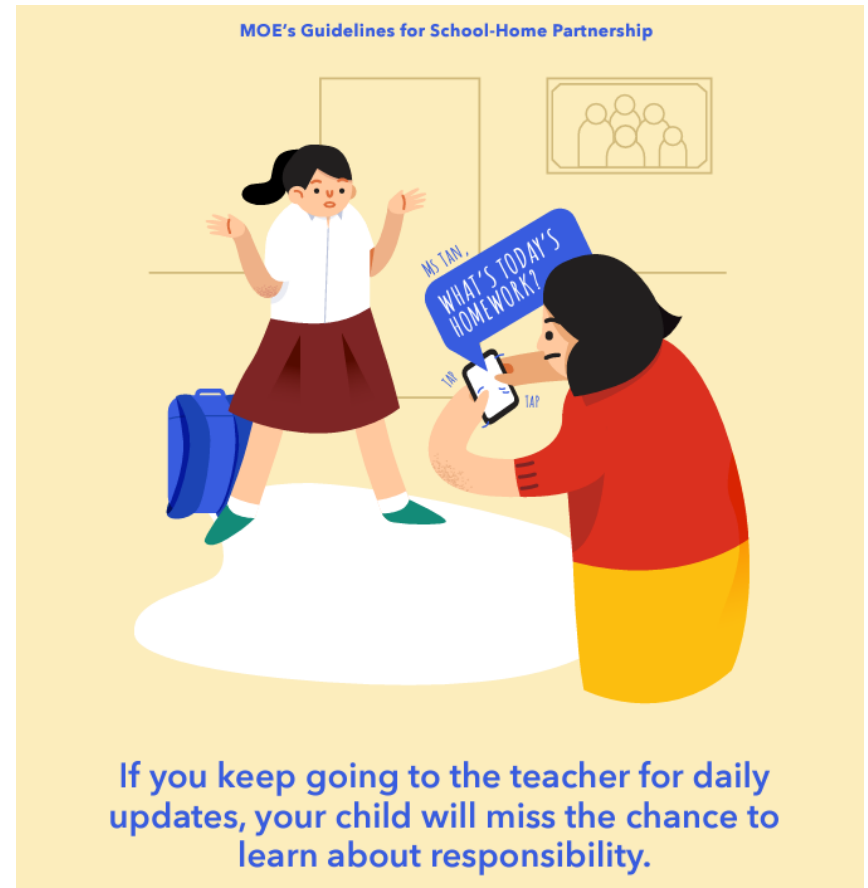
School Rules & Guidelines
