Student Matters

4. Strengthening Student Cyber Wellness. MOE aims to develop students as digitally empowered, future-ready learners and innovators, and achieve cyber wellness through the use of technology in a safe and discerning manner. In strengthening student cyber wellness, the school has refreshed the Character and Citizenship Education (CCE) curriculum to include cyber wellness programmes in class and at school assemblies, with the aim to equip students with the skills and knowledge to be safe and responsible users of technology. The school is also looking into identifying possible at-risk students and implementing targeted intervention programs to provide them with the necessary support to develop better digital habits.

6. Increase in Prices of Canteen Food and Drinks. Amid the rising cost of food commodities, the school has reviewed and approved the increase in the prices of the canteen food and drinks, with effect from Term 3 (24 June 2024). The revision of the set meal prices was in accordance with the guidelines from MOE. The detailed information on prices will be displayed at the individual stalls. Safety, Security and Well-Being

7. Safe Environment. The number of reported dengue cases in Singapore has climbed steadily since January. Keeping the mosquito population in check is key to minimising dengue transmission, and everyone has a part to play. The school has stepped up on housekeeping in the school compound to check for potential mosquito breeding grounds, especially after a rain. We also encourage parents to keep your household mozzie-free by practising B-L-O-C-K (see Figure 1).

9. High Temperature Weather Condition. Recent reports of higher than usual temperature may result in our students experiencing heat related incidents. To mitigate such potential situations, we have allowed our students to report to school in their PE attire until further notice. We have also stepped up the monitoring of student activities in open spaces, with regular reminders to our students on the need to hydrate adequately.

10. No Smoking. Under the Smoking (Prohibition in Certain Places) Act 1992, smoking is prohibited in the educational institutions, including within 5 metres of the fenceline. For the latter, we have put up signs at the main gate and the 2 side gates to reminder public who intend to light up. See Figure 3.
