
## New Staff to the Sembawang Family...


### Important Information...

#### Safety, Emergency Preparedness & Student Well-Being

- 4. <u>Emergency Preparedness Drills.</u> The Attendance and Temperature Taking Exercise was conducted on 9 July. During this exercise, students were responsible for taking their own temperature using their personal Oral Digital Thermometer (ODT). This exercise maintains our school's preparedness to reactivate the attendance and temperature taking regime should the need arise, while educating students about personal health responsibility.
- 5. As part of our emergency preparedness, the school plans to conduct an evacuation drill where our school population will practise the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) for a school lockdown exercise, simulating an intruder incident. This will be followed by a fire-related scenario where the school population will assemble at the designated assembly area (AA). Your child's Form Teachers will provide detailed information about the drill via Parents Gateway (PG) in due course.










- 6. LTA and School Joint Road Safety Advisory. The school has collaborated with the Land Transport Authority (LTA) to issue a Joint Road Safety advisory via PG on 27 June. The advisory cautions against parking or waiting along Sembawang Drive during school arrival and dismissal times. It highlights various traffic offences and reiterates that authorities will take strict enforcement actions against offenders. We thank parents for your understanding and cooperation to ensure safety for all road users
- 7. Safety Measures. We have implemented necessary safety measures to address concerns arising from both infrastructure design and external factors. The school has successfully resolved one potential safety hazard from each of these circumstances (see Figure 1).

- School Attire. In view of the current weather conditions and anticipated heat stress in 8. July, students are permitted to wear their PE attire throughout the school day. We will review this arrangement towards the end of the month.


Figure 2 – First Aid and AED Training for Teachers

- 9. First Aid and AED Training. First aid knowledge and skills are essential for effective response during medical emergencies. Our staff maintain current certification in basic first aid and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) usage through biennial training (see Figure 2).




### **Student Matters**

P6 Preliminary Oral Examinations. Our P6 students will sit for their Preliminary Oral Examinations on 28 and 29 July. The examinations will be conducted in the afternoon after









regular school hours. Normal lessons will continue for all students during this period. P6 students will be dismissed immediately after completing their examinations.

11. The World as Our School. Our overseas learning journeys to Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur in May 2025 provided selected P5 students with valuable opportunities through cultural visits and interactions with local students. These experiences helped them develop into confident individuals and active contributors while reinforcing our core values. Figure 3 – Students on Overseas Learning Journeys (OLJ)












Figure Programme on Staying Drug Free

  - c. Provide learning opportunities for students to understand the significance of our National Day.


Figure 6 – P5 Students at the NE Show on 5 July








Building Mental Resilience. Mental resilience is crucial for student well-being, ensuring our students are well-prepared to face challenges, overcome obstacles and achieve their full









potential. We develop this through various engagements focusing on core values, competencies and student support. Our approach encompasses:

# a. Nurturing a Growth Mindset: A Foundation for Resilience

Our teaching and learning programmes are built on the cornerstone of growth mindset, emphasising that abilities can be developed through dedication and effort. This mindset encourages students to view challenges and setbacks as opportunities for growth rather than indicators of fixed ability, enabling them to better cope with stress, persevere through difficulties and bounce back from setbacks.

# b. FTGP: Equipping Students with Social and Emotional Competencies

The Form Teacher Guidance Period (FTGP) plays a vital role in supporting students' mental resilience. Through structured lessons and activities, students develop essential social and emotional competencies, including emotional management, positive relationships and coping strategies. FTGP provides a platform for addressing specific well-being issues, ensuring our students are well-equipped to navigate life's challenges.


## c. One-to-One Interaction: Building Rapport and Support

Our twice-weekly One-to-One Interaction sessions provide dedicated time for teachers to build strong relationships with their students. 

Figure 8 - Dad and Child Bonding at Camp with Dad






- 19. The Camp with Dad for P1-P3 levels is scheduled for August. The registration has since been closed. Parents, please look out for the upcoming updates and announcement.
- North West Outstanding All-Rounder Student Award 2025. We are pleased to 20.






