






Growth Mindset

- people believe that their most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work brains and talent are just the starting point


- this view creates a love of learning and a resilience that is essential for success in life

Leads to a desire to learn and therefore a tendancy to ...






Student Agency

Strategies to develop Student Agency

- Provide opportunities for Students' Voice, Choice & Advocacy
 - E.g. Young Journalist Programme, Be the Change,
 Head Prefect Election, Good Morning, Sembawang
 radio Show, Project Work, Celebration of the Arts COTA
- Develop Student Leadership
 - E.g. Prefects, Class leadership, SBPS PAL, Buddy system
- Focus on *Process of Learning*
 - E.g. Gradual Release of Responsibility, Voice & Choice, Feedback to Feedforward, Blended Learning, ICTenabled learning

Attendance & Punctuality

- All students are expected to be punctual for school, lessons, assembly, CCA and any school-organised activities.
- 0715: Silent Reading
- 0730: National Anthem & Pledge-Taking Ceremony

Attendance & Punctuality

- All absence from school <u>MUST</u> be supported by a medical certificate and/or where appropriate, a letter of explanation from parents (not more than 5 letters per semester)
- Refrain from taking students for extended holidays as it will affect his/her learning in school.
- Persistent late-coming and absences: school will engage parents to discuss intervention

- go home, accompanied by parent/guardian




- Students are expected to wear the prescribed school uniform. (with name tag sewn)



- Check that your child completes his/her assignments within the allotted time
- Monitor the time that your child spends on playing computer games, chatting on social media sites, watching television programmes, playing with smartphones etc.





Face challenges with grit and positivity

Road Safety

- Ensure that your child crosses the road using designated pedestrian crossings.
- At traffic light junctions, he/she should not cross the road when the "red man" is on or when the "green man" is flashing (even if there is no traffic on the road).

Road Safety

Remind your child to

- stand behind the yellow line (not too close to the edge of the road) while waiting to cross.
- practise the kerb drill and raise his/her hand when crossing the road so that motorists can see them easily.
- be alert when crossing roads and walking on pathways.
